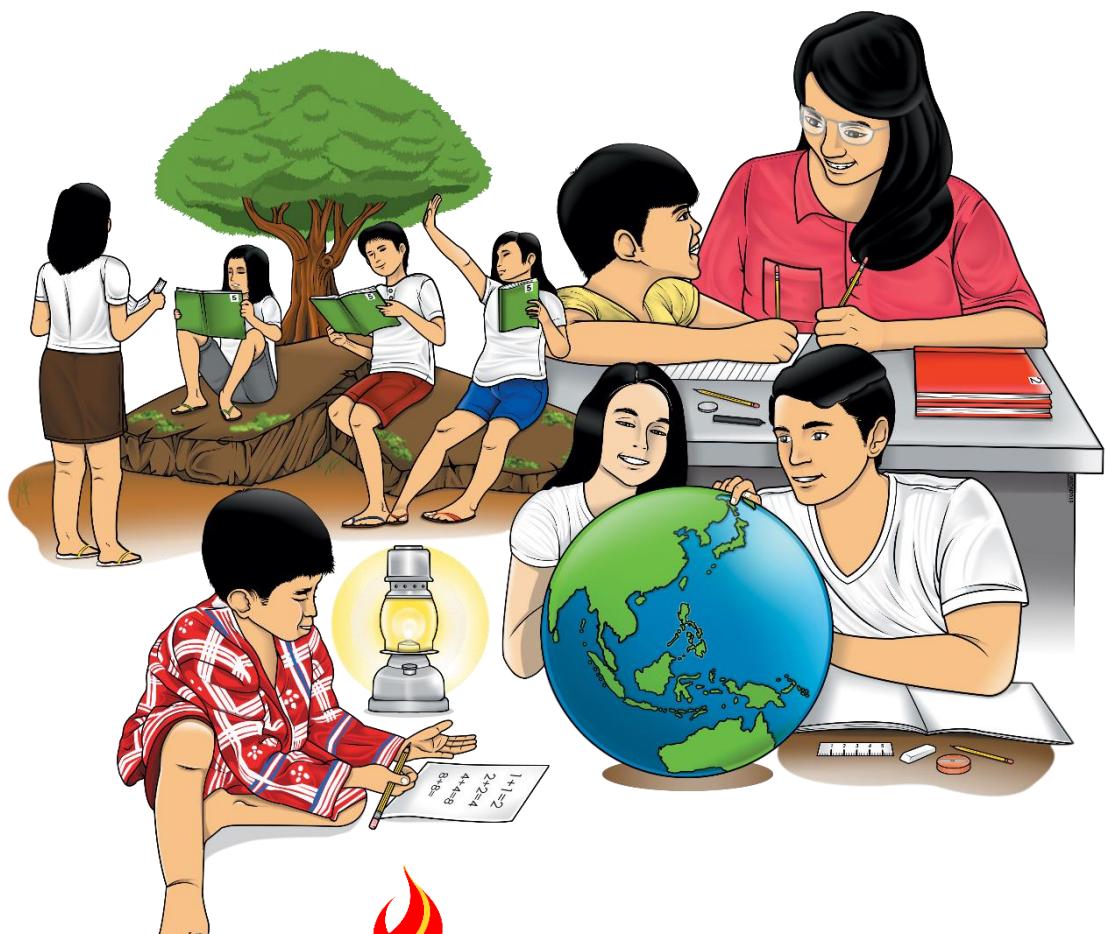



please wait for me". Betty smiled and said, "take your time my twin sister. Thank you so much!"



The Three Degrees of Adjectives

1. positive degree It is used to describe a noun or a pronoun.

Big is a sample word in a positive degree of adjective.

Sample Sentence: *The car is big.*


2. comparative degree- It describes two nouns or pronouns.

Bigger is a sample word in a comparative degree of adjective.

Sample Sentence: *The van is bigger than the car.*

3. superlative degree- It describes three or more nouns and pronouns. *Biggest* is a sample word in a superlative degree of adjective.

Sample Sentence: *The bus is the biggest among the three*
